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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 September 2017

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 September 2017. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The purpose of the charity is to conserve, regenerate and promote the restoration of native and other woodlands and to maintain, improve and extend paths within and linking such woodlands in the geographical region of Laggan as an important part of Scotland's natural environment for benefit of the public.

Significant activities

Development of afforestation and woodland regeneration projects, introduction and development of interpretative sites and centres. To foster and develop community participation in woodlands, their management and use. To reintroduce trees, plants and wildlife appropriate to the native woodlands of Scotland.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 September 2017

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Trust is currently in a stable financial position and has taken a pragmatic view with respect to holding modest and appropriate contingency reserves at the year-end. The final year of funding from the Scottish Government Strengthening Communities Fund has allowed us to continue to employ 2 members of staff, one full time, the other part-time. Key to the prioritized activities has been to ensure that visitors to the Forest Centre, be it via Open Days with our Partners, with our volunteers, the Mountain Bike trails or passing tourist traffic understand the natural environment in which they are in and are supplied with the relevant leaflets to enjoy both access and information about the Strathmashie Forest and its environment.

Activities over the past year

There has been a varied programme of activities over the past year - all supporting our overall charitable aims. These activities included joint events with the Cairngorms National Park in running a Nature Weekend, Open Days with Forest Enterprise and the Centre continuing to host two major events in the National Mountain Bike calendar, which exposed the many participants to our overall aims. Members from the local community supported a number of these events with their active participation and contribution. Additionally during the year the Orienteering course which was re-laid through part of the forest was enjoyed by many participants - young and old - with many of the natural assets of the Forest and its wildlife exposed to new families.

In February 2017, a new set of Trustees was elected to the Board with an appropriate balance of community members' capabilities very evident in Forestry, the environment and business. In addition to member trustees, one other trustee was co-opted to the board to broaden the skill and knowledge base of the Board. We also gratefully acknowledge the contribution that SNH volunteers were able to provide, to assist us in a number of projects around the Forest centre. We continue to benefit from the knowledge and experience of those very familiar with the Forest and Natural Heritage and we look forward to continuing that close working relationship. The Centre and its Cafe continues to be supported and is staffed separately part-time by residents from the community and region.

The Trust took the decision to delay replanting of that part of the forest which it owns into 2018 or 2019 with the agreement of Scottish Woodlands, who have also facilitated a small grant to assist that re-planting which will comprise an appropriate mix of different trees - conifers and broadleaf - to enhance the overall long term appearance of the area. Forest Enterprise continue to harvest the Achduchil & Feagour forests, parts of which house the mountain bike trails and we maintain regular contact with Forestry to ensure the paths and trails throughout are maintained and accessible to all.

It remains our on-going aim to ensure that all our trails and walks are open to the community members and visitors alike and we rely on our Partnership with the Forestry Commission, local businesses and volunteers to help deliver a positive experience of the forest environment.

Conclusion

It has been a constructive year with direction and support for our activities given by our community members and the public at large. We remain grateful to our funders, employees, volunteers and trustee directors for their unstinting support and trust that they will continue to support our aims in the future.

All are to be thanked for their significant efforts in enhancing the objectives of the Trust, and its relationships with our critical partners (Forest Enterprise, Cairngorms National Park Authority, Scottish Natural Heritage) as well as formulating revised plans for the coming years. At the AGM of the Trust, members provided unanimous support for the Trust to explore a potential Forest acquisition process under the Community Asset Transfer Scheme (CATS) notified to us by Forest Enterprise. This was consistent with our stated purposes and much planning for progressing this occurred throughout the year.

Looking to the future, The Trust will continue to explore how it can expand the understanding of our natural forest environment with additional facilities for children and families around the Centre as well as undertake a feasibility study for future expansion of the Trust's portfolio.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial review

Reserve policy to date has been concerned with acquisition and development of the Forest Centre however this will be reviewed to reflect our enhanced responsibilities e.g. for staff and development activities. This will be reported and considered by our Board at our regular meetings. The Trust has a positive reserve balance on hand with no deficit anticipated however we do recognise a need to continue active fund-raising now that the project to develop the vision into reality has been resourced.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The trust was set up in September 1998 and was recognised as a Scottish charity with effect from 8th June 1999. The Trust is administered in accordance with the terms of the constitution as recorded in the Memorandum and Articles of Association which states that the board of Trustees should consist of not less than 3 members and no more than 12, the majority of whom should reside within the community of Laggan's postcode.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The trustees are those appointed at the annual general meeting. Appointment and removal is in accordance with the Articles of Association which requires that one third of the trustees or nearest number upwards should retire from office. No trustee can serve more than 2 consecutive terms of office without at least one year out of office. Nomination of trustees shall be by not less than two members of the company. Election shall be by vote of members who may be present in person or by proxy at the AGM each member shall have one vote for each vacancy on the board.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 September 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Land at Strathmashie - nil%
Plant and machinery - 20% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
